Topic: Advice from an Orchid Specialist

Thanh is an owner-operator of Springwater Orchids (Melbourne, FL). He is an engineer by trade, but also has been collecting and growing orchids for over 30 years. His orchid business began in 2001, mainly selling on the internet but gradually moved to orchid shows in recent years. Thanh loves orchid species. And although he grows and sells all orchid genera, his forte has always been the genus of Paphiopedilum. He collects fine plants; grows, sells, breeds, and enjoys sharing his experiences with his customers and colleagues. His passion in paphs resulted in numerous award winning plants and an on-going paphs breeding program using local lab work, and local growing environment. His goals are to bring the excellence of a paphs breeding program back to America, and augment the enthusiasm of paphs growing by way of sharing his growing experience and educational programs via shows and society speeches. You will see these goals reflected in his breeding program with well thought process to target various audiences; from easy growing/ flowering plants to state of the art breeding catered to most difficult collectors' interest, in parallel with conservation of breeding species, improving overall plants and flower quality, broadening their growing conditions to make growing paph a joy.

Tasks for September

Although more inches of rain fall in June, more hours of rain occur in the often slow, seemingly endless drizzles of September. Frequently a day or two can pass without so much as a solid hour of truly bright sunshine to lift our spirits and dry out our plants. Days are growing much shorter also, with long nights when our plants are wet from the frequent rains. Coming at the end of the rainy season when disease pressure has been building, September presents the maximum opportunity for fungal and bacterial diseases to take hold of our orchids. Hopefully careful watering practices and the judicial use of fungicides (as recommended last month) will have diminished the potential for disease in our collections. But even in the best managed collection, September calls for extra vigilance. Keep a close eye out for problems and remove immediately any plant that shows the first sign of fungus to a dry location to prevent the disease being spread by splashing rain drops. Good hygiene is particularly important this month. Clean up growing areas and remove any dead leaves, twigs or other organic debris from the plants and the ground. In September numerous diseases that linger in decaying plant material find the ideal conditions that allow them to jump to the living tissue of our prize orchids. Such problems can develop more quickly in September than in any other month. September is a month to stay home and be there for your orchids. Look at every plant, every day.

Remember that your plants will have grown considerably over the summer and that the space they occupied comfortably in the Spring has now been filled by their own growth as well as their neighbors. Space them out. Now is perhaps the time to decide to hang some of the larger ones where they will dry much more quickly. The small cute ones left behind on the bench will be very appreciative of the extra air and light.

A Tribute to Fred Gilbert


Fred Gilbert was a long-time member of the Boca Raton Orchid Society. He passed on a few weeks ago in his mid-nineties. Fred and Ginger's daughter Margie has informed us that <u>Fred's memorial will take place</u> <u>September 13, 2021, at 2:00 PM at Gutterman-Warheit Memorial, 7240 N Federal Highway, Boca Raton, FL 33487</u>.

Fred's dedication to our organization was legendary. Fred and the late, great, Dave Hogaboom, organized and taught the BROS After School Orchid Program in local Boca elementary schools for many years. After Dave passed on, Fred taught the program with Shirley Wilde. Cheryl Dodes taught with them for one year. Bj Saul is currently the teacher of the program, along with past and present volunteers Shirley Wilde, Mirta Sacon, Teresa O'Neil, Karen Zarif, Sheila Bell, and Janice Larit. The program is currently halted due to the pandemic.

Hundreds of children discovered a love for orchids because of "Mr. G" and his enthusiasm. In the program, children learn to identify orchids, then compare similarities and differences for a variety of orchids, including Phalaenopsis, Vanda, and Dendrobium. Each child receives a Phalaenopsis orchid to take home and care for. Finally, they color orchid pictures to be put on display at the BROS February Valentines Show.

When Fred and Ginger moved to Stratford Court of Boca Pointe Senior Living Community this past spring, Fred realized that the already beautiful grounds would look much better if the trees were adorned with orchids. So, he contacted Alan LaDuke, who arranged for a team of more than a dozen BROS members to place orchids in the trees this past May. The orchids were provided by Fred, Marion Israel, And Barbara Barrie. An article about this endeavor was in the May 2021 issue of the BROS newsletter.

Now the beautiful orchids will stand as a living memorial to Fred Gilbert. Boca Raton Orchid Society is lucky to have known such a wonderful man. May he rest in peace.

Every month members have the opportunity to show their latest achievements. They can be admired then judged and you may even win an award ribbon! Fill out a exhibition slip and place it with your entry. Please follow the rules below to avoid disqualification.

- 1. Clearly print the orchid name and your full name.
- 2. It must be featured in the correct category.
- 3. You must have owned the orchid for at least six months.
- 4. The plant must not have insects or disease.
- 5. Display your orchid in an attractive container.
- 6. Each plant registered earns you a FREE raffle ticket!

Winning plants will be featured in the BROS newsletter the following month.
